

In The News....

Crystal King Cortez is a 2001 graduate of Truman High. She graduated from the University of Michigan and wanted to begin her dream of teaching school. In order to accomplish that goal, she moved to Florida with her husband, leaving family and friends behind. She states it was the hardest decision to make but she knows it was the right thing to do as she is in the classroom with her students. She is a math teacher in Avalon Middle School in Orlando, Florida where she was recently chosen as "Teacher of the Month".

This past September she was selected as one of 70 Florida math and science teachers to take part in a zerogravity flight as part of the weightless flights of discovery program offered by the Northrup Grumman Foundation. The experience began with a workshop explaining the science of the parabolic aircraft flight that creates temporary weightlessness.

Crystal planned experiments to conduct during the flight. The actual flight was from the Kennedy Space Center aboard a modified Boeing 727-700 jet called G-force. Specially training pilots fly a series of maneuvers called parabolas. The flight includes 15 of these maneuvers creating low gravity conditions similar to what would be experienced on the moon or mars.

The flights have helped the teachers to demonstrate to students that math and science are not only cool but also fun. Crystal talked of her amazing feeling as she floated, spun, did pushups with no problem and flew in the air like superwoman.

Back in the classroom, Crystal had her middle school math students graph the parabolic flight "on the coordinate

plane in quadrant 1. She and her students also talked about integers, number lines, positive and negative directions and maximum and minimum heights.

She feels that she has inspired her students by showing them how crazy and brave she was just to get them interested and passionate about math.

Lynn Cleary (Kennedy, '73) is currently superintendent of Lincoln Consolidated Schools in Ypsilanti. Lynn has had a remarkable 29 year career in education. Her first position was junior high band director in Romulus. Her next move was to the Westwood Schools where she was the middle school and high school band director. She also accepted the position of athletic director. She was appointed to Assistant Principal at a middle school in the Lincoln Consolidated District. Two years later she was named principal of the middle school. She ran both buildings with a combined enrollment of 3000 for two years. She states that it was an eye opening experience but that she loved very minute of it. Last February the Superintendent left for personal reasons and Lynn was asked to take the position of Superintendent. Lynn states that her time at JFK as a student were the best years of her life. She was in the marching band and had dreams of returning to JFK as band director. That did not work out but as you can see she went on to a remarkable career.

Liesa Owen (Kennedy, '82) has authored a book under the pen name "Virginia Elisabeth Farmer". The book, "Lizzie's Blue Ridge Memories" is going to print in a few weeks.

Mei-Ling Hopgood, (Truman,

'90), has authored and published a book. It is a memoir called "Lucky Girl". The hardback book is published in 2009 by Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Mei-Ling was adopted from Taiwan by her parents, Chris and Rollie Hopgood, who were both educators in the Taylor School District. Mei-Ling studied journalism at the University of Missouri, and is an award-winning journalist who has written for the Detroit Free Press, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, National Geographic Traveler, and the Miami Herald. She has also worked in the Cox Newspapers

Washington Bureau. She lives in Buenos Aires, Argentina with her husband and daughter.

Mei-Ling wasn't really curious about her Asian roots, though she knew she was adopted. Then one day, when she was in her twenties, her birth family from Taiwan came calling. The Wangs wanted to meet her; they wanted her to return home. As her sisters and parents pulled her into their lives, claiming her as one of their own, Mei-Ling fell in love with them. But this unexpected reunion has a price. She uncovers the devastating secrets that haunt them to this day as she

attempts to understand the hard choices of her birth mother.

"Lucky Girl" journeys into Chinese culture, its magnificent sights, wartorn history, while revealing the personal suffering wrought by the country's tightly held traditions. Mei-Ling finds that although both the Hopgoods and the Wangs have shaped her identity, it's up to her to figure out who she is. Hers is a tale of love and loss, frustration, hilarity, deep sadness, and great discovery that helps her understand the meaning of family.

Western Michigan University. While at the University, he was awarded All Mid-American Conference Academic First Team and ranked fifth in
the entire conference with a .355 batting average.
